The RNOC also provides long-term financial support in the form of annuities to beneficiaries both the UK and overseas. Funds can be made available within 48 hours in urgent cases.

RNBT spent almost £2.5 million on grants and RCPs in 2021/22 assisting 2,172 applicants across a spectrum of fundamental needs that include food, clothing, accommodation, fuel and utility bills, disability aids, training for second careers, house repairs and household goods, respite holidays and help with all manner of financial difficulties. RNBT has already reviewed areas where they may be able to assist families struggling with increased utility bills, for example by assisting with home insulation. Serving personnel and their dependants last year received £76k of support.
